The Irish Bishops encouraged Catholics to "keep Christ at the center" of Christmas: They made this remark in their Pastoral Letter for Advent: "It may be impossible for large congregations to assemble for Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day," but "Christmas is about more than just one day."

Catholics can experience the spiritual richness of this special season in many ways, including gathering as a family to pray and sing a carol round the Christmas crib in their homes. They suggest paying a visit to a local church at some time during the twelve days between Christmas Eve and the Epiphany to offer prayers for family members and for those particularly impacted by the pandemic.

The hope of Advent and the joy of Christmas should inspire the faithful "to reach out to those in greatest need at this time", namely people whose livelihoods have been seriously threatened by the pandemic, people coping with bereavement, families that cannot be together, those in nursing care homes who can only have limited visits from their loved ones.

The Bishops note that these restrictions, offer "greater opportunities for prayer and for reflection, for family time and space to enter into the true meaning of Christmas." (This Article is from Vatican News website)

Vatican City, Nov. 2020: The Vatican announced the details of the 2020 edition of the annual Christmas display in St. Peter's Square, intended to be a sign of hope and faith in the midst of the coronavirus outbreak.

"This year, even more than usual, the setting up of the traditional space dedicated to Christmas in St. Peter's Square aims to be a sign of hope and faith for the whole world," said a press release from the Vatican City Governorate.

The Christmas display "wants to express the certainty that Jesus comes among his people to save and console them," it said, "an important message in this difficult time due to the COVID-19 health emergency."

The unveiling of the nativity scene and lighting of the Christmas tree toke place Dec. 11. Both will be displayed until Jan. 10, 2021, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. (This article by Hannah Brockhaus from the Vatican News website.)
